Courses will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis according to the list below unless an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science is completed.

### **ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND MILITARY CREDIT**

Students with a score of 3, 4, or 5 on an advanced placement exam may receive credit at BYU for each examination. Students who have been on active duty in the military service for more than one year may receive 2 semester hours of credit in Wellness and 4 semester hours of Military Science credit.
