Freshmen Enrollment

Freshmen are accepted only once a year. Application deadline is February 15 and enrollment is limited. Application forms are available in the department offices.

Transfer Students

Transfer students in art disciplines will need to meet with area coordinators. Transfer students in design disciplines will need to participate in one of two reviews: reading days in April or reading days in August. Contact the department office at 422-8773. Transfer students will also need to submit an application.

Note: Individuals receiving notice of acceptance will be permitted to register for the foundation 100-level core courses fall and winter semesters or spring and summer terms.
